## Rescue Rates

- All prices are out of Texas to the following 48 contiguous states
- All prices are per individual animal. (If you fully book my vehicle, 5 kennels, rates are an additional 15% off.)
- Kennels are: (2) 40" kennels, (2) 36" kennels, (1) 24" Kennel
- An additional 20% off is extended for a transport of 9. That means 2 dogs per kennel plus 1 dog for 24" kennel that are compatible and can ride together. (This is the maximum I can transport, unless there is a mother traveling with her offspring.
- Mother's traveling with their offspring are calculated as follows: Cost of 1 kennel plus \$35.00 per offspring.
- All rescues must be accompanied with a CVI/Health Certificate as per USDA guidelines. If your vet is charging you more than \$45.00 for this certificate, it would be wise to stop using these greedy people and find a veterinarian that is reasonable! Why should a transporter compromise their rates because of the greed of someone else?
- All animals must be free from any and all communicable diseases and this will be affirmed with a CVI/Health Certificate.
- Please note, we offer further savings on transports in addition to the 20%. Please inquire for those.
- Rates are not for individuals rescuing a dog. Rates are for 501c3 registered non-profit organizations only!

## How I arrived at my rates?

The average trip from San Antonio, TX to Boston, MA is approximately 2050 miles and takes approximately 30 hours to drive non-stop. This trip on average can take anywhere from 2.5 days and 3.5 days. Gas prices range from \$2.89/gallon to as high as \$3.89/gallon from state to state. In addition, toll costs are alone \$30.00 to \$50.00 depending on routes taken to destination.

So an example of a transport:

1. For a 2050 mile trip, there would be 7.45 tanks of gas. Average fill up ranges with the average cost being \$50.00 for my vehicle. Total gas costs for Texas to Massachusetts average about: \$372.50
2. Tolls: \$30.00
3. Food & Drink (1 full meal per day + drinks+ snacks) \$50.00/day

This amounts to \$552.50 in total transport costs just to reach the destination city!

This total does not include:

1. Food & Water Costs
2. Supplies used for transport
3. Care of Animals
4. Laundry
5. Sterilization of kennels and cleaning of vehicle which on average takes 4 hours of time
6. Car maintenance: average oil change ranges from \$49.99 to \$100.00
7. Wear and tear on vehicle and tires which can range from \$450.00 to \$800.
8. Maintaining insurance on transports and AAA incase anything happens with vehicle on transport
9. Any potential hotel stays.

All of these are covered by Pawsitive Trailways, LLC because we recognize 501c3 rescues struggle with having funds for the transport of their animals.

So in retrospect, this entire transport only costs a mere .17cents per mile!
